





- Materials: bricks, covered with marble and











Central dome on pillars and semi-domes.

Basilica floor plan, with central rotunda.





















MOSAIC

- Mostly religious themes.
- Bright colours. Use of golden backgrounds.
- Rigidity, no expression, frontality.

- 10. Incense burner.





- 3. Chalice


- 4. Members of the court (Eunuchs?)
